SHOCKING RAILWAY DISASTER NEAR GRANTHAM

Express Engines and Ballast Train in Early Morning Collision

EIGHT MEN LOSE THEIR LIVES; FOUR OF THE INJURED IN HOSPITAL

Terrible Scenes Outside Barkston

GRANTHAM A TOWN OF MOURNING

GRANTHAM IS THIS WEEK A TOWN OF MOURNING, FOLLOWING THE MOST SERIOUS RAILWAY DIS-ASTER SINCE 1906, WHICH OCCURRED NEAR BARKSTON STATION EARLY ON SUNDAY.

IN A TERRIBLE COLLISION THERE BETWEEN A RAILWAY BALLAST TRAIN AND TWO LIGHT EX-PRESS ENGINES COUPLED TOGETHER, FIVE MEN WERE RILLED INSTANTLY AND SEVEN OF THEIR FELLOWS RECEIVED GRASTLY INIVERSE.

FELLOWS RECEIVED GHASTLY INJURIES.

Three of the latter died later in Grantham Hospital—one the same night, one early on Tuesday morning, and the third on Wednesday, and throughout the week doctors of the town and the staff at the Hospital have been making an almost superhuman fight for the lives of the remaining four patients.


